Do you think you need to have your own car? The answer greatly varies depending on where you live. I lived in Tokyo for 38 years, and my parents owned a car. However, I have never driven it myself because I didn't need to; Tokyo has countless train lines and public buses available. [A], parking a car is very expensive; for instance, some places charge 600 yen to park for 30 minutes.

Over time, it *seems* that this situation has impacted the younger generations' interest in cars, especially those living in a huge city like Tokyo. This phenomenon is often called "youth disinterest in cars." According to a survey conducted by a company that offers car subscription services, more than half of the respondents living in Tokyo agreed that "youth disinterest in cars" applied to them. Furthermore, the same company reports that about 55% of them answered "no" to the question "Do you want to have your own car?" One of the most common reasons was "because public transportation is enough." Additionally, 40% of people living in other rural cities said they did not want a car, although public transportation was insufficient in such areas. This may suggest that the aspirations to own a luxury car, which used to be considered a status symbol, might be becoming a thing of the past.





- Since ancient times, the sun has been one of the most prominent objects of worship throughout the world. Human history has a long list of sun gods: *Re* and *Atum* in the ancient Egyptian religion; *Shamash* in ancient Mesopotamia; *Surya* in Hinduism; *Mithra* in ancient Indo-Iranian mythology; *Huitzilopochtli* in the Aztec religion; *Inti* in the Inca religion; and *Amaterasu* in Japanese mythology. Today, the sun is considered to be one of the most abundant sources of green energy available to humankind.
- There are several ways to tap the sun for renewable energy. One of the most familiar techniques is to capture solar energy with flat-plate collectors and transfer it to air or water, which can be used directly or stored in shielded tanks. This method is commonly used to supply homes with hot water or space heating. Another technique is to convert solar radiation directly into electricity using solar cells. Small solar cells are used in low-power devices such as calculators or watches. Larger units can provide power for larger devices like water pumps and weather and communications satellites.
- Replacing fossil fuels (coal, petroleum, and natural gas) with renewable energy is very important for our lives, industries, and even for future survival. Fossil fuels are non-renewable resources that modern civilization is rapidly using up. When fossil fuels are burned, they cause a number of environmental problems, including air pollution and excessive carbon dioxide (CO₂) release that leads to global warming. However, in some sectors, such as marine and aviation transportation, there is no viable alternative to fossil fuels. Powering large ships and airplanes requires enormously high energy density that even the most advanced lithium-ion technology cannot provide. Electric boats and aircraft do exist, but to carry hundreds or thousands of tons of cargo or passengers over long distances, fossil fuels are still necessary.
- The mission, then, is to find a sustainable liquid fuel that can replace fossil fuels. Companies and research institutions worldwide have been working on this task, developing technologies to produce "solar fuels" from readily available sources like water, carbon dioxide, and sunlight. In the production of solar fuels, solar energy can be harnessed in several ways: in photovoltaic systems, solar energy is stored in solar cells and used to drive chemical reactions to create liquid fuels; in photocatalytic systems, chemical reactions are driven directly by sunlight; in photothermal systems, concentrated solar heat drives chemical reactions. Each process can generate environmentally friendly solar fuels that have sufficient energy density and are readily convertible into heat, electrical, or mechanical energy.
- Solar fuel seems to be a gift from the gods, but some difficulties need to be resolved before it can be mass-produced and commercialized. One major issue is the low efficiency of production. It takes a lot of work and is an extremely complicated process to convert solar into chemical energy, making the product far more expensive than any existing fossil fuel. Designing strong and reliable systems for energy conversion is another challenge. A greater dedication to research and development efforts is necessary in making solar energy a staple energy source. This should not be a surprise to us, as numerous stories tell us that the sun gods are rather hard to please.
